Johnson, Sr. heads The Memorial Foundation; this foundation will continue to promote awareness of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial and its tenets of Democracy, Justice, Hope and Love as well as to support the general upkeep of the Memorial in future years. Johnson led the Washington, D.C. Martin Luther King Memorial Foundation as President and CEO from 2002 until 2013. The President of the United States and the U.S. Congress charged the MLK Foundation with erecting a memorial on the National Mall in Washington, D.C. to honor the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Under Johnson's leadership, the MLK Memorial Foundation raised \$127 million to complete the memorial. OUR HISTORY & MISSION

The National Dental Association (NDA) had its earliest beginnings in 1900, when 12 practitioners felt they needed a professional organization. In November of that year, the small group met and formed the Washington Society of Colored Dentists in the District of Columbia. The name was changed in 1907 to the Robert T. Freeman Dental Society, in honor of the first Black dental college graduate. Although the seeds were sown in 1900 for a professional organization, it was Dr. D. Â. Ferguson of Richmond, Virginia, who began propagating the urgency of a national organization of Black dentists. After convincing many other professional colleagues of this need, the National Association of Colored Dentists was formed on May 1, 1901, at Howard University College of Dentistry. This new organization met annually for five years, but eventually failed to sustain enough interested members to continue meeting.

In 1913, under the leadership of Dr. Ferguson, a nucleus group of 29 progressive men from Virginia, Maryland, and the District of Columbia came together to form a new organization, the Tri-State Dental Association. By 1918, the Association included memberships from 14 states. This growth reflected and warranted a wider program, one national in scope. The Tri-State Dental Association was reorganized in 1918 into the Interstate Dental Association, and by 1923, 21 states were represented at its annual meeting.

From 1923 to 1931, the influence of the Interstate Dental Association reached local communities and dental groups with the concept of a "national idea." The Commonwealth Dental Society of New Jersey organized in 1927 and became affiliated with the Interstate Dental Association in 1928. In July 1932, Commonwealth sent a delegation to Interstate's annual meeting held at Howard University College of Dentistry. The purpose of this meeting was to invite the Interstate Dental Association to Commonwealth's annual meeting in Bordentown, New Jersey, specifically to form a national organization. This invitation was accepted and in 1932 the Interstate Dental Association became the National Dental Association.

The NDA embraces the philosophy that health care is a right — not a privilege

— of every American.

In assuming the responsibilities of the national organization, the Association embarked upon an intensive program to increase membership and perfect its organizational structure. A new constitution defined the relationship of the constituent societies to the national organization. In addition, scientific sessions, standing and special committees, and an official journal were developed.

For 104 years, the NDA has been a national forum for minority dentists and a leader in advancing their rights within the dental profession, the armed services, the government, and the private sector. Since its inception, NDA members have been dedicated to providing dental care, education and guidance to the disenfranchised. The NDA embraces the philosophy that health care is a right — not a privilege — of every American. Today, the NDA is a non-profit 501(c)(3) that is the premier dental organization for ethnic minorities. It represents a family of 10,000 dentists, students, hygienists, assistants, and spouses. It has alliances with many other organizations, institutions, and government agencies that share its mission. Through scholarships and support programs, the NDA promotes dentistry as a viable profession.

In 1976, the NDA Foundation was formed. It is a non-profit 501(c)(3)entity that was organized to pursue charitable, educational, and scientific research endeavors. In 1996, the NDA formed the Corporate Roundtable (CRT). Through the NDA-CRT, the NDA has formed many longterm partnerships that benefit both entities, while elevating health awareness in underserved communities in the U.S. and abroad.

NDA goals and commitments are shared by its auxiliary organizations, namely, the Auxiliary to the NDA, the National Dental Assistants Association, the National Dental Hygienists' Association and the Student National Dental Association. Together, these groups compose a membership that is represented in all 50 states and several countries abroad.


EXHIBIT FLOOR PLAN





WHS History:

The first National Dental Association Women's Seminar was held in the early 1980's under the direction of Dr. Marie Holliday (Dallas, TX). In 1982, having been denied a request to form a women dentists' interest group under the auspices of the NDA, Drs. Shirley Bailey and Emily Lee (Los Angeles, CA) founded the Association of Black Women Dentists (ABWD). The group was organized to address the needs and concerns of African American female practitioners. Following a successful women dentist's luncheon at the 1989 NDA convention in Washington, D.C., the host committee became the founders of the first branch of the ABWD, the Women Dentists of Metropolitan D.C.

The New York NDA Annual Convention in 1992 provided a fertile opportunity to launch the first official Women Dentists' Awards Luncheon, chaired by Dr. Erica Bailey. During that convention, Dr. Hazel Harper (Washington, DC) presented the concept for a Women's Health Symposium to be incorporated into the NDA annual convention, to the NDA Board of Trustees, and House of Delegates. The concept was approved and in 1993 the 1st Annual Women's Health Symposium was held in Boca Raton, FL under the leadership of Dr. Hazel Harper, the first National Chairperson. Since the first WHS, Drs. Sheila R. Brown (Chicago, IL), Beverly Murdock (Somerset, NJ), and Angela Jamison Johnson (Atlanta, GA) have also served as National Chairpersons.

Over the years, the WHS has evolved to include an annual community service component, a scientific seminar, and a fitness session. As we now celebrate the 24th Annual WHS, we acknowledge the commitment of past leaders, and pay tribute to the cadre of women who hold positions of prominence in the National Dental Association at the local, state, and national levels. In 1997, we applauded the milestones and achievements made by Dr. Hazel J. Harper, NDA's first woman President. Others who followed were: Dr. Cynthia Hodge (Nashville, TN, 1999); Dr. Joy Jordan (Cleveland, OH, 2004); Dr. Leslie E. Grant (Glen Arm, MD, 2006); Dr. Sheila R. Brown (Chicago, IL, 2011); Dr. Alison P. Riddle-Fletcher (Baltimore, MD, 2014, unexpired term), Dr. Carrie B. Brown (2015), Dr. Judy Greenlea Taylor (2016) and Dr. Kim B. Perry (2017). In 2014, we proudly dedicated the Women Dentists' Awards Luncheon in memory of Dr. Alison P. Riddle-Fletcher, the 90th President of the NDA, for she epitomized the virtues of phenomenal woman leadership – grace, poise and dignity.

It is estimated that between 26.4 million and 36 million people abuse opioids in the world with approximately 2.1 million people in the United States suffering from addiction to pain killers and an estimated 467,000 to other drugs in this group. To address the complex problem of prescription opioid overuse and abuse, we as health care providers who deal daily with pain related issues must recognize and consider the special nature of this challenging problem. We must also be cognizant of our potential contribution to this rising epidemic. As we move forward in the landscape, we will need to understand the negative and growing morbidity and mortality associated with the epidemic while continuing to improve the lives of our patients by eliminating pain and improving health outcomes and overall well-being.

There is a significant movement underway to address the problem through the implementation of new prescribing practices, regulations, and guidelines. It is imperative that we are knowledgeable about these changes and how and they will impact our practices and licensure. The session will seek to engage you and provide valuable information that will help you combat the problem of opioid abuse as well as be compliant with current rules and regulations.






