## CAVITIES



Both children and adults are at risk of developing cavities, or tooth decay. Cavities are the result of poor oral hygiene and retained dental plaque on the tooth surface. Bacteria in plaque produce acid that destroys the tooth's enamel and its underlying layer the dentin, and can eventually reach the tooth's nerve.

#### NDA-HEALTH NOW-New Orleans® "Back-to-School-Cavity-Free!" Program



ew Orleans-The second event of the Summer Campers "BACK-TO-SCHOOL-CAVITY-FREE!" program was held at the Milne Recreation Center on April 22, 2017. The first events were held on March 4th at the Treme, Joe W. Brown and Lyons recreation centers. The program is a collaboration of the National Dental Association (NDA), New Orleans Recreation Development Commission (NORDC) and NDA-HEALTH NOW-New Orleans®. The goal is to provide free dental care for the city's 4,000 summer camp enrollees and to send each camper back to school with happy smiles and a healthy head start. Corporate sponsors are: VOCO, Colgate, Henry Schein, Inc., Sunstar, and the Entergy Foundation. VOCO has donated fluoride varnish applications for the 4,000 students and teamed up with the NDA to develop an informational flyer with fluoride varnish FAQs for the parents and guardians. The project has the support of the Louisiana Department of Health, the State Oral Health Coalition, the New Orleans Health Department, and Hear to HEAL, Inc., a non-profit providing in-kind support.

The program was conceived to address persistent oral health disparities impacting vulnerable and underserved populations. In a major report published in 2010 by the Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals Oral Health Program, "Oral Health in Louisiana", a document on the Oral Health Status of Louisiana's Population, these important findings were cited:

- There are 80 Title I schools in the New Orleans area
- In 2009, 38.5% of 776,127 Medicaid eligible children received dental services
- 478, 533 children covered by Medicaid did not receive dental care in 2009
- 87% of the state is designated as a Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA), including Orleans and the surrounding parishes (which are also designated as Dental Health Shortage Areas)
- In Louisiana, there is a chronic shortage of oral health data and the state's Oral Health Program is striving to overcome this challenge.

In 2014, the NDA launched NDA-HEALTH NOW-New Orleans® as part of a national crusade to address issues of access and disparities. But since that time, a popular New Orleans trumpeter, Travis Hill, died while on tour in Japan from a dental infection that caused his heart to stop beating. Unfortunately, preventable deaths from dental disease have continued. NDA-HEALTH NOW® (Health Equity, Access, Literacy, Technology and Hope. National Outreach on Wheels) enlists the support of community partners and a vast network of volunteers to provide dental services and health education to increase access to care. The coordinated efforts of voluntary health organizations, consumer groups, and concerned citizens, are vital to the success of this program.

To date, 182 children have received screenings and fluoride varnish applications, and an additional 167 children and adults have received Oral Health Education. Out of 182 children, 30 children (16.5%) were identified with decayed teeth needing dental treatment and 9 children needed urgent care. Twenty-three children (12.6%) of those screened did not have dental insurance, and 22% (40 children) did not have a "dental home," or a dental office where they go regularly to receive treatment. Twenty of the children (11%) reported both being insured and having a dental home, yet they still had at least one cavity, reinforcing the point that having dental insurance and a dental provider does not guarantee that ALL of the barriers to care have been removed. The goal is to remove ALL obstacles to dental care.

At her presentation to the summer camp directors at the Treme Center on April 12th, popular local pediatric dentist, Dr. Wanda Augillard, spoke about the program and about plans for each of the summer camps to be visited by the EXCELth Mobile Dental Unit, directed by Dr. Douglas Cross. NORDC is encouraging each of the summer camp sites to conduct a "dental health day." There are 40 summer camps operating this summer, beginning June 5th and ending August 4th.

The project is supported by a vast network of community organizations, businesses and volunteers including: EXCELth, Inc., Audio Visual Technology, Hear to HEAL, Inc., The New Orleans Dental Society, The Pelican State Dental Society, New Orleans Chapter of the Links, Incorporated, New Orleans Chapter of Jack and Jill, Inc., Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, LSU School of Dentistry, Middle Collegiate Church, St. Anne's Academy, Xavier University College of Pharmacy, Dillard University School of Nursing, National Black Nurses Association, Black Men of Labor, Yellow Pocahontas Indian Tribe Mardi Gras, Sudan Social and Pleasure Club, and the University of New Orleans Pre-dental students.

s many of you know, the National Dental Association is now 104 years old. The founders set up a Constitution and Bylaws document to govern and direct the activities of the organization. Over the years those documents have evolved with the times. Most recently being updated in 2012. The House of Delegates is the body that sets policy and monitors the Constitution and Bylaws. To that end, the Constitution and Bylaws Committee is a standing committee of the House of Delegates.

With each coming issue of the Flossline we will try to have a short update on procedures and policies of the NDA.

In this issue we will focus on correspondence. The House of Delegates being the policy-making body is a representation of the local components and constituent chapters. The House of Delegates writes and prepares position papers on several different areas that it believes are consequential to the well-being of our members and the communities we serve. All statements issued by any member, chapter, or officer that is specifically representing the National Dental Association should be consistent with all published policy papers. Any written correspondence that expresses an opinion on any subject that has a written policy statement, should be sent to the National Office for approval, prior to offering that statement for public consumption. It is extremely important that we speak with one voice as an organization, and that the public is clear about our position. When statements or correspondence differ from the House of Delegates approved statements, it sends an inconsistent message, which could in turn damage relationships inadvertently.

The NDA leadership encourages involvement of local chapters, and they understand there may be different opinions or points of view about a subject or policy, but we can only speak with one voice and with a consistent message if we truly wish to be heard.


