Why Oral Health?

- The number one childhood disease is tooth decay, 5x more common than asthma and occurs 4x more often than early-childhood obesity*
- Approximately 25% of adults over 60 in the U.S. have lost all their teeth; half of those lost their teeth as a result of dental caries and periodontal disease like gingivitis
