

Greetings from the National Dental Hygienists' Association! NDHA is excited to announce that we are turning 60! The National Dental Hygienists' Association was founded in 1932 and reactivated in 1962. Our reactivation initiated by Dr. James B Singleton, Dr. Eugenie Mobley, and Barbara Ashby Robinson. In the spring of 1962, Dr. James B Singleton, Dr. Eugenie Mobley, and Barbara Ashby Robinson of Meharry Medical College contacted several African American dental hygienists and invited them to meet in Detroit, Michigan for the purpose of reactivating the organization. During the 1962 National Dental Association (NDA) convention, the NDHA reactivated and implemented a restructuring initiative designed to enhance the visibility of the association. In 1963 NDHA elected it first President, Barbara Ashby Robinson. The NDHA has joined the NDA in holding concurrent annual conventions ever since. While the NDHA and the NDA still hold their functions jointly, the NDHA functions as an autonomous organization.

2022 is an important year for NDHA because it marks the return to our first live convention since July 2019 and 60 years since our reactivation. The NDHA Board of Trustees is working tirelessly to make our 60th anniversary a memorable convention for all of those that attend. Our goal is to honor the 13 women who became our first Board of Trustees and our Past Presidents. We will celebrate our "Diamond Anniversa-

ry" with exuberance because, just like a diamond, NDHA could not be broken. Our "Diamond Anniversary" will be a time to reflect on our past, be thankful for our present, and look forward to our future.
