Seeing through the lenses of social justice and implicit bias, we can better understand the origin of disparities in health and the propagation of inequitable healthcare. The President's Symposium will address this crisis, issue a collaborative call-to-action and provide a framework for sustained, transformative change. A panel of distinguished leaders will discuss 1) Systemic inequities and Medical Gas-lighting, 2) Advocacy, policy reform and collaborative influence; 3) the role of the non-profit sector and the impact of grassroots interventions; and 4) the acceleration of oral health and primary care integration.

Background Statement

Underserved and vulnerable rural and urban African American, Hispanic, Native American and White, along with special populations, such as the elderly, and those with special disabilities, are disproportionately burdened with disease states that either go untreated and or undiagnosed compared to majority populations. The prevalence of diseases such as diabetes, hypertension, oral disease, mental illness and substance abuse, along with cancer and now the sequalae of COVID-19 continue to be on the rise in these communities. The impact of these disease states falls primarily on individuals at or below the federal poverty level, and vulnerable special populations. These significant health disparities, along with the social determinants of health (SDH), impact population health and quality of life. The 2000 Surgeon General Report on Oral Health informed us of the connection between oral health and overall health. However, there continues to be states where there is a lack of access to oral health care for pregnant women and underserved and vulnerable populations on Medicaid and Medicare, along with a national healthcare workforce shortage to meet the needs. It has been reported that healthcare providers of color are more likely to return to their communities and provide the quality care and prevention counseling these populations need and deserve. However, the percentage of African American dental students admitted to and graduating from dental schools has remained relatively stagnant for several decades. Additionally, candid discussions with some students, faculty and healthcare clinicians of color, reveal a continued concern around the inequities they and the communities that they serve face in the area of overall healthcare.

In considering the concerns around systemic racism, implicit bias, and gender bias that reveal themselves in the area of "Medical Gaslighting", women and people of color are impacted the most. Their concerns are often dismissed, leading to diagnoses being missed or delayed, disproportionate referrals to specialists compared to their Caucasian counterparts, and lack of prevention counseling. Low health literacy among this group also leads to difficulty navigating an already dysfunctional health system and contributes to disparities in their treatment within the medical system. These biases are not only impacting African American females, but also physicians, dentists, nurses of color and underserved patient populations of color. It is widely recognized that not only are traditionally disenfranchised populations still being marginalized, but oral health, despite its critical link to systemic health, is also being marginalized.

This year's President's Symposium will lay the foundation for the formation of a new initiative to address Advocacy, Justice, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion. It will build a framework with input from a collaborative crosscutting team of mission minded individuals and higher learning education institutions (presidents, provosts, deans, ADEA, DDS, HDA, SAID, NIH/NIDCR, researchers, faculty and students). The initiative will address the challenges that face Latinx and Native American populations through collaborative efforts with their respective organizations/entities and it will look at the further upstream determinants.



he Student National Dental Association continues to reflect on the strength and the growth of our organization as we celebrate our 50th Anniversary. SNDA currently has active chapters in over forty dental schools across the country, and is growing each and every year. This year the National Executive Boards has launched several new initiatives to help ensure that SNDA is the premier educational resource for pre-dental and dental students of color.

As part of her strategic plan Student Dr. Reina Ransom launched, Office Hours, a seminar series that focuses on highlighting minority faculty members across the country during monthly continuing education style lectures. These sessions allow students access to dental faculty members of color across the county and encourages students to think about careers in academic dentistry. The National Executive team has also launched a new seminar series focusing on managing finances. These seminars highlight community leaders and young

practitioners to share their thoughts on several topics including: purchasing a home, negotiating contracts, and starting a practice.

HBCU Connect, SNDA's signature predental program, was initiated under the leadership of Dr. Akeadra Bell and during the 2021-2022 year SNDA has taken this initiative to the next level by partnering with dental schools across the country in order to allow our USNDA students to have access to the resources necessary to gain admission into dental school. We have also launched a new partnership with the Mayo Clinic Dental Residency Programs to host a seminar series focusing on clinically relevant topics within each of their specialty programs. The purpose of this partnership is to help increase the amount of Black or African American Students in specialty programs across the country. SNDA continues to be a strong force with in the dental community. We look forward to fellowshipping with the NDA and the other axillary organizations in Arizona, to continue to celebration of all of our organizations and our effect within the community.


