PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



reetings to our faithful and fearless National Dental Association Family.

It remains an honor and a glorious privilege to serve as the 99th President of our historic, transcendent, and legendary organization. After well over 110 years, the mission of the National Dental Association is still impactful and relevant. As I have previously stated, we have been divinely chosen to carry the torch of the NDA valiantly into the future - our future is now. In 2023, we are intentionally "Bridging the Generational Gap: Back to the Future of Advancing Oral Health Equity, Student Mentorship, and Raising our Profile."





Speaking of intention, our administration selected the three following tactics from our 2021-2024 NDA Strategic Plan upon which to focus to keep us "fit for the future": mentorship, membership, and leadership development. The successful launch of the S.M.I.L.E. Healthcare Pathway Program this summer in Washington DC is truly a testament to the impact of the



NDA mission ("advocating for the needs of and mentoring dental students of color"). Our "call to action" is to improve from the 3.8% of African American dentists in the United States towards representation in dentistry that mirrors that of society. By increasing the number of providers in underrepresented and underserved populations, we aim to directly improve access to care and to advance oral health equity. Additionally, removing systemic barriers to care in the workforce will result in a potential increase in the pool of diverse dental educators which goes a long way in the recruitment and retention of minority dental students. Based on the quality of the capstone projects presented by the participants, the Student Mentoring with Immersive Learning and Enrichment (S.M.I.L.E.) Program exceeded the high expectations set at Nasdaq with Henry Schein earlier this year. And, I am truly thankful to ALL responsible for making our launch a success.

With enthusiasm, purpose, and effective leadership in place, the S.M.I.L.E. program is poised to grow and to potentially become a signature effort of the NDA.

In regards to the membership experience, our 110th Annual National Dental Association Convention/Extravaganza was simply AMAZING! In our effort to significantly "bridge the generational gap," our entire NDA Family (SNDA, NDHA, NDAA, ANDA, NDAF, USNDA, NDA-CRT) convened together this summer in New Orleans for the first time since 2019. From the start, our convention offered a "back to the future" like experience for me. When attending my first NDA Annual Convention in Atlanta as a member of the SNDA in 1999. New Orleans Milne Rec Center Hosts NDA-HEALTH NOW® 10th Anniversary Event

DA-HEALTH NOW-New Orleans® held its 10th Anniversary community outreach event on July 21, 2023, at the Milne Recreation Center in New Orleans, Louisiana. Two hundred 5-12-year-old summer campers attended the children's event which took place from 8:30 a.m. – 11:30 a.m. during the NDA annual convention. The CVS Health Mobile was also on-site to provide free health screenings. Support for the event was provided by Colgate, Crest Oral-B, CVS Health, Henry Schein Cares Foundation, DentaQuest, Diverse Dental Society, the Links, Incorporated, Listerine, the National Dental Association Foundation, the National Dental Hygienists Association, the Student National Dental Association and VOCO.

The New Orleans Recreation **Development Commission** (NORDC) is a longstanding partner of NDA-HEALTH NOW®, our award-winning signature program. The NORDC summer camps that participated were the Milne Center, Cut-Off and Treme. Several community organizations provided volunteer support including EXCELth FQHC, New Orleans Chapter of the Links, Incorporated, New Orleans Chapter of the National Black Nurses Association. LSU Health Sciences Dental School and Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc.

Popular local dentists, Drs. Wanda and Terrence Augillard, were team leaders who spoke to parents at the summer camps' orientation sessions about the program, the importance of prevention and the benefits of fluoride varnish. The event also featured an oral health training program for nurses conducted by Drs. Nicole Cheek and Jennel Osborne (Nurse Planner). Immediately following the training, the nurses engaged with the children in all of their activities.

NDA-HEALTH NOW® (Health Equity. Access. Literacy. Technology. Hope. National Outreach on Wheels) was launched in 2013 to provide services, education, access, and resources to underserved communities. The New Orleans program, "Summer Smiles for Summer Campers" is a fun-filled dental field trip for summer campers from four local summer camps. The "Passport to Total Health" makes learning fun! This educational journey included seven (7) stations: a Brush-a-Thon, Screening and Fluoride varnish application; Oral Health Videos; Happy Smiles are Healthy Smiles; Oral Hygiene Instructions; Safety First and Injury Prevention; Nutrition: Healthy Smiles=Healthy Bodies; and Step-Up-to-STEM®. Step-Up-to-STEM® is an ageappropriate children's program

with an oral health focus. This program was developed by dental students and members of the Student National Dental Association.

NDA President. Dr. Marlon D. Henderson, a private practitioner in Shreveport, LA, a graduate of the Louisiana State University School of Dentistry, and an alumnus of the General Practice Residency at the Medical Center of Louisiana, both in New Orleans, was interviewed by WDSU Channel 6 News after the event. The event also included dental screenings and referrals, and fluoride varnish applications. All participants, volunteers and guests registered to attend and parental consent forms were required for participation.

The NDA-HEALTH NOW® community outreach event is a component of the NDA Annual Convention. It is popular with the convention attendees including dentists, students, spouses, dental assistants, hygienists and corporate partners who mobilize as volunteers to support the program.











About NDA-HEALTH NOW®

Launched in 2013 the project goals are to 1) increase health care access; 2) eliminate disparities; 3) increase health literacy; and 4) promote prevention. NDA-HN also features and promotes the interests of interprofessional health teams. In 2016, NDA-HN won an award from the American Society of Association Executives, and since its inception has implemented and/or supported 165 programs in 16 cities and 11 countries. The results include 75,000 direct beneficiaries including children and adults and more than 1.5 mass media and social media exposures. In recent years, NDA-HN has also mobilized volunteers and provided care packages for victims of Hurricane Harvey (Houston) and Hurricane Dorian (Bahamas). In 2020, personal protective equipment and supplies (PPE) were donated to COVID pandemic community centers. NDA HOSTS SUMMER SESSION OF IPSLCS AT THE **NEW ORLEANS CONVENTION**





he summer session of the NDA Interprofessional Student Leaders Colloquium and Summit (IPSLCS) took place July 21-22, 2023 during the NDA Convention. The theme of the program was "Health Equity, Advocacy and Reform in Louisiana: The Role of Future Leaders". The event was supported by a grant from the CareQuest Oral Health Institute to Strengthen Community Voice and State Advocacy. The grant initiative is for a 12-month program targeting the state of Louisiana. Other sponsors were Participants including attendees from Louisiana institutions. LSU. Southern, Xavier, ???, and the New Orleans Chapter of the National Black Nurses Association, All expenses for selected students and training faculty were covered by the grant. All expenses for selected students and training faculty were covered by the grant.

Now in its 7th year, the IPSLCS program is grounded in the concept that leadership training for students in all disciplines is essential for achieving optimal health because, despite significant progress made in clinical care,

research and technology, new products and materials, innovative techniques and delivery systems, and other advances, America is still falling short of achieving health goals for all. The project's purpose is to promote advocacy, justice, equity, diversity and inclusion to improve health and oral health outcomes in the nation's underserved communities. This initiative focuses on providing transformational leaders of tomorrow with the skill sets they will need over the span of their careers, to become change agents and to achieve goals that will impact systemic, social and behavioral change for improved population health.

Dr. Marlon Henderson, NDA President and a native of Shreveport, LA stated, "The NDA is intentional in our efforts to enhance access to care. In our quest for oral health equity, it has long been important to the NDA to build a diverse pipeline and a pathway for future healthcare professionals. By advancing oral health equity, and strengthening community voices, there will be an increased likelihood of new state policies that will increase access to dental care in Louisiana's most underserved communities. I am proud to begin this important initiative by training student leaders in my home state!"

Although onsite sessions took place on July 21-22nd, there were mandatory preconvention assignments that were assigned to the students, including reading the Louisiana State Oral Health Plan 2018-2023, viewing of 1) Senator Ben Cardin (D-MD) U.S. Senate Oral Health Hearing; and 2) mandatory webinar, "Why Dental Health Is Medically Necessary".

Day 1 consisted of Leadership Training sessions at the Hyatt Regency from 8:30 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. World class trainers for the session were 1) Alvenia Rhea Albright, **Executive Leadership Coach-**Development Specialist and Founder and Executive Director of Rhea of Hope Foundation, Inc. Topic: "Transformational Leadership. Examine the "Face in the Mirror"-'How' You Lead is the Question"; 2) Dr. Judy Greenlea-Taylor, Dental Director for CareSource, CEO of her practice in Union City, GA, public health Consultant

to the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and Past President of the NDA. Island University Nursing School. The Milne Center IP nurses' event sponsors were Remote Area Medical, Crest Oral B, CVS, Listerine and VOCO. Immediately following the training, the attendees engaged with 200 summer campers, aged 5-12 years old at the NDA-HEALTH NOW 10th Anniversary Milne Center community outreach event. The IPSLCS participants learned first-hand about community outreach education for children. After lunch, attendees returned to the Hyatt where they toured the NDA Convention Exhibit Hall, and interacted with corporate vendors about advances in dental technology, procedures, and materials. A highlight of the tour was receiving volunteer orientation in the Remote Area Medica (RAM) pop-up, OSHA-compliant dental treatment tent.

The next phase of the 2023 IPSLCS program will include student group assignments to prepare presentations and legislative testimony to achieve the goals of the Louisiana State Oral Health Plan.





At the end of the 12-month CareQuest Oral Health Institute grant cycle, results from the IPSLCS needs assessment surveys will determine the level of awareness about oral health as integral to overall health and the impact of the short-term program interventions. Survey results and data analysis in the first year will be used for continued program development that will advance the goals of the program and provide opportunities for the NDA and its partners to speak with a unified, amplified voice for Advocacy, Justice, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion and to address oral-systemic health as a driver for whole-body health.

NDA S.M.I.L.E. Program Launches! By Nicole Cheek, DDS and Kim Perry, DDS, MSCS, FACD

he S.M.I.L.E. (Student Mentoring with Immersive Learning and Enrichment) Healthcare Pathway Program is a partnership between the National Dental Association, Henry Schein, Inc., the Robert I. Schattner Foundation, Inc., and other professional associations. This program aims to help mentor future healthcare professionals, enhance health literacy, expand diversity in the healthcare workforce, and ultimately improve health and overall outcomes in underserved communities nationwide. In this inaugural year, the program accepted forty rising 9th and 10th-grade students from several areas around the country who spent a week living on-campus at Howard University. The students engaged in daily visits to institutions of higher learning (Howard University College of Dentistry, University of Maryland School of Dentistry) and a healthcare facility (Mary's Center) to submerge themselves in various aspects of oral health while working in groups on their Capstone Projects, which were presented at the closing ceremony at the end of the program.

The S.M.I.L.E. Healthcare Pathway Program is designed to create a pathway for aspiring healthcare professionals by providing mentorship, educational resources, and hands-on experiences. Through this program, students engage with experienced healthcare professionals who quide and support them in their journey. They also participate in workshops, hands-on activities in the dental simulation labs and clinical operatories, capstone presentations, and networking events allowing them to learn from industry experts and build valuable connections.

One of the key objectives of the program is mentorship. Each student completing the program is matched with a mentor to continue a year-round engagement; furthermore, students and parents or quardians have continued access to all of the mentors volunteering with the program. Additionally, resources have been identified and pledged to support any work of the students who return home to their communities to share what they have learned as "S.M.I.L.E. Ambassadors" or Oral Health Ambassadors.


Another key objective of the program is to enhance health literacy among participants. By providing educational resources and workshops on various healthcare topics, we aim to equip them with the knowledge and skills needed to understand the complex healthcare system better and make informed decisions about their potential careers in health and their personal and family wellness. Furthermore, the S.M.I.L.E.

Healthcare Pathway Program seeks to address the lack of diversity in the healthcare workforce. By actively recruiting participants from underrepresented communities, we aim to create a more inclusive and representative healthcare workforce that better reflects the diverse patient populations it serves, raising the percentage of African-American dentists above the current 3.8%.

Lastly, the program aims to improve access to quality healthcare for underserved communities. By connecting participants with community organizations and healthcare facilities, we hope to empower them to become advocates for their communities and work towards reducing healthcare disparities.

The S.M.I.L.E. Healthcare Pathway Program is an exciting initiative that brings together the expertise and resources of various organizations to mentor and support future healthcare professionals. By providing them with the guidance, knowledge, and experiences necessary for success, we believe this program will have a positive and lasting impact on the participants and the communities they serve.
