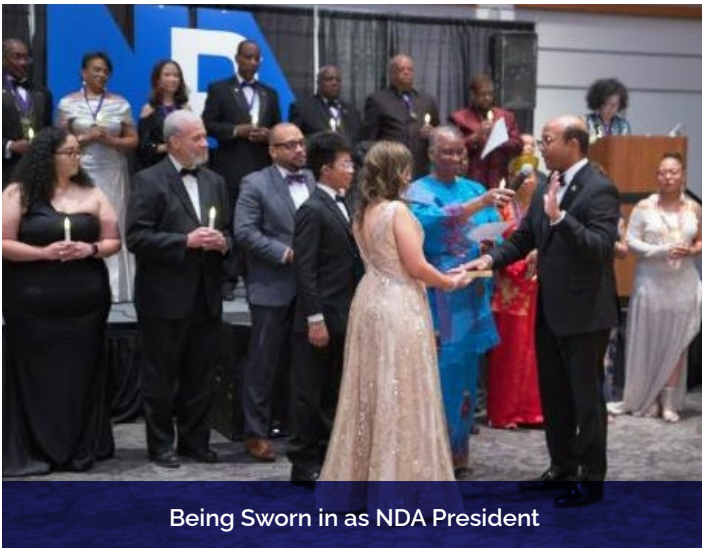
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PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

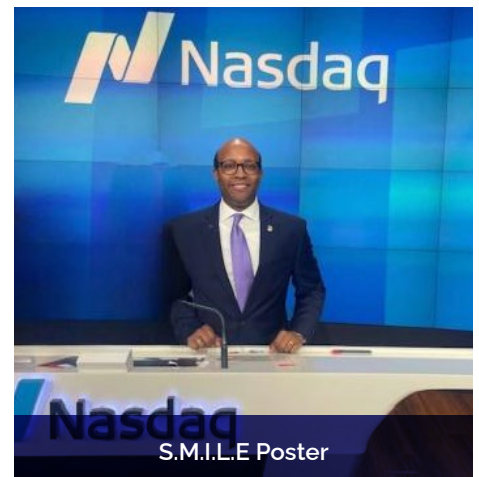


Being Sworn in as NDA President

(Student Mentoring with Immersive Learning and Enrichment) Healthcare Pathway Program while “Ringing the Bell” at Nasdaq with Henry Schein. The subsequent successful launch of the S.M.I.L.E. Healthcare Pathway Program this summer in Washington DC is truly a testament to the impact of the NDA mission (“advocating for the needs of and mentoring dental students of color”). With enthusiasm and effective leadership in place, the S.M.I.L.E. program is poised to grow (expanding next year to Nashville, Tennessee) and to become another signature effort of the NDA that started with us.

The National Dental Association's House of Delegates is looking for enthusiastic members who can facilitate moving the organization forward. The House has multiple committees that require active participation in support of the organization's mission and vision, and they would love to see more members getting involved.

The committees include:

Committee on Awards

- Receive nominations for the annual awards of the Association, individual members, constituent societies or associations, and component societies or associations.

Committee on Credentials

- Determine and record the roll of the House at each meeting and report at the time provided in order of business.

Committee on Public Health

- Study, develop, and recommend standards and policies for organized programs relating to the improvement of the dental health of the public.
- Assist the component societies and other agencies in the development of

programs and policies related to the improvement of the dental health of the public.

Committee on Legislation

- Protect and further the interests of the public and the dental profession in matters of patents, legislation, and regulations and make recommendations of plans and methods to the Board of Trustees in conformity with policies approved by the House of Delegates.
- Disseminates information, which will assist the constituent societies in problems involving the enactment and enforcement of legislation affecting the dental health of the public or the practice of dentistry.

Committee on National and International Relations

- Cooperates with dentists and dental groups in the United States and other countries to exchange dental knowledge and information in conformity with policies adopted by the House of Delegates.

Committee on Scholarship Aid

- This committee shall have the authority to investigate applicants for loans from the Association's special fund, created to help needy and worthy students in the nation's dental colleges, particularly at Howard Dental College and the Dental School of Meharry.

Committee on Ethics

- Consider proposals for amending the Code of Ethics and make recommendations regarding the same to the

House of Delegates and the Board of Trustees.

- Provide advisory opinions regarding the interpretation of the Code of Ethics.

Committee on Dental Trade

Reference Committee

- It shall be the duty of the reference committee to consider reports referred to it; to conduct open hearings and to report its recommendations to the House of Delegates.

Consistent with the mission of the American College of Dentists (ACD), the Ethics and Professionalism Award recognizes exceptional contributions by individuals or organizations in the promotion of ethics or professionalism in dentistry. This award specifically recognizes ethics and professionalism and is the highest honor the College can bestow in this important area. The 2023 recipient was The Eddie G. Smith Leadership Institute of the National Dental Organization! The successful nomination packet was submitted by NDA leaders/ACD Fellows: Drs. Pamela Alston, Hazel J. Johns, John T. Daniels II and NDA President Marlon D. Henderson.

During the 2023 ACD Convocation at which Dr. Robert Lamb presided as ACD President, he gave a background on the Award. He stated, "Since its founding in 1920 the American College of Dentists has championed ethics, ethical behavior, and professionalism in dentistry. In keeping with its historical mission and its longstanding role as the 'conscience of dentistry,' the Board of Regents desired a tangible means of recognizing exceptional contributions by individuals or organizations for the promotion of ethics and professionalism. This



effort became the Ethics and Professionalism Award of the American College of Dentists, which is made possible through the generous donation by the Jerome B. Miller Family Foundation."

Past NDA President and ACD Regent At-Large Dr. Pamela Alston read the citation. "The National Dental Association's Eddie G. Smith Leadership Institute is recognized for its ongoing emphasis on ethics and professionalism. Its namesake, the late Dr. Smith, served as NDA President from 1972-1973. He fervently believed that to carry the mantle of leadership, leaders must devote themselves to becoming students of the leadership process. For almost two decades, the Institute has provided training sessions that are timely, informative, and crucial to the goal of developing capable, effective, and seasoned leaders. Training in areas such as Legislative Advocacy, Leadership Succession, Organizational Behavior, Grassroots Mobilization, Ethics and Servanthood has equipped participants to make exceptional contributions to the promotion of ethics and professionalism in dentistry and in the communities that participants serve. Some Institute alumni go on to lead the NDA as presidents and as Board of Trustees chairmen. They also go on to lead with excellence, professionalism, and strong ethical grounding inside and outside of organized dentistry including community organizations and oral health care organizations. Institute alumni hold positions on the



Boards of academic, corporate, professional, and philanthropic institutions. The NDA Eddie G. Smith Leadership Institute is most worthy of the 2023 Ethics and Professionalism Award." 99th NDA President Dr. Marlon Henderson accepted the award on behalf of the NDA. He was also inducted as an ACD Fellow this year.

Those of us who know the history of the relationship between the NDA and ACD are cognizant that the ACD has groomed the NDA for this award. In recent years, the ACD has sponsored the speakers for the Eddie G. Smith Leadership Institute Summer sessions during the conventions and the ACD Presidents and Presidents-Elect have attended the EGSLI sessions. This year, Past ACD President Steven Chan received many accolades for his keynote



session, "Organized Dentistry Leadership Journey: Lessons and the Pathways to Overcoming Vicissitudes Victoriously." He adeptly told stories in the Griot tradition of unforeseen obstacles and obstructions, stories of misdirection and sinkholes, stories of coming eye-to-eye with decisions—and some of the life and leadership lessons learned which are forever unforgettable to the session participants. ACD Fellow Dr. Fotini Anagnostopoulos-King presented a well-received session, "Ethics and Ethical Decision-Making Models."



Dr. Leo Rouse Received the ACD William John Gies Award

The William John Gies Award is the highest honor the American College of Dentists can bestow upon a Fellow. Named after William J. Gies, who was instrumental in shaping the College and the entire dental profession, this award has been given since 1940 and recognizes Fellows who have made exceptional contributions to advancing the profession and its service to society. Dr. Leo E. Rouse, Howard University College of Dentistry Professor Dean Emeritus and an ACD Past-President was a 2023 recipient. Dr. Teresa Dolan read the following citation, "Dr. Leo Rouse has been committed to the dental profession since the 3rd grade when his family dentist became his role model. Since then, his energies have been devoted to the profession. Dr. Rouse has contributed in many ways – as a clinician, an educator, a mentor, an Army officer, a leader, and as a strong voice for the profession. His experience of having a strong role model instilled in Dr. Rouse the importance of mentorship and taking the time to instill in others the joy of dentistry and helping others. When Dr. Rouse speaks, people listen. He has used this gift to advocate for dentistry whether in the armed services, dental education, or the profession as a whole.

Dr. Rouse's career started in the military as a captain in the Army Dental Corps. Eventually, he rose to the rank of colonel and served in several leadership positions including commander and chief operating officer of the US Army Dental Command. His service has been recognized by his many awards including the Legion of Merit, the Meritorious Service Medal, the Army Achievement Medal, the National Defense Medical, the Army Service Medal and the Army Overseas Medal. After leading in the armed services, Dr. Rouse joined Howard University. At Howard University, Dr. Rouse was associate dean for clinical affairs and chair of clinical dentistry. He was appointed as the interim dean of Howard University College of Dentistry in 2003 and then awarded the deanship in 2004. Dr. Rouse retired in 2015. His distinguished service to Howard University was recognized by the award of emeritus dean status.

Dr. Rouse is a leader among leaders. His leadership acumen is widely recognized throughout the dental community. He was recognized by his peers with his election as chairman of the Board of Directors for the American Dental Education Association, an organization that serves as the voice for over 25,000 dental and allied dental education students, faculty, and staff. He was also elected to serve as president of this organization, a leadership position which is the pinnacle leadership position of our profession.

His exemplary service to the profession has been recognized by numerous awards including the ADEA Distinguished Service Award, ADA Distinguished Service Award, the Legend and the Trailblazer awards from the National Dental Association, and an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters from the Western University of Health Sciences. Dr. Rouse has positively impacted the lives and careers of thousands of dental students, dentists, and allied dental professionals. He is most deserving of this distinguished award." 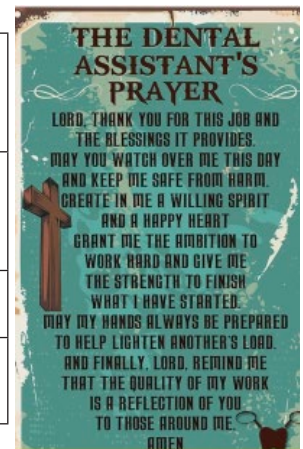

HEALTH EQUITY CALL TO ACTION (HECTA)




HECTA brings together thought leaders in various health disciplines to create a cohesive call to action that works to eliminate racial and ethnic health disparities and to elevate oral-systemic health as critical for the overall health and well-being of African American populations and address oral-systemic health as a driver for whole-body health.

In 2022, the National Dental Association (NDA) received a \$125,000 grant award from the CareQuest Institute for Oral Health to design and implement an initiative to “Strengthen Community Voice and State Advocacy”. A research-driven initiative was developed to collect data assessing the impact of interventions of three existing NDA programs. The NDA programs assessed were NDA-HEALTH NOW®, the Interprofessional Student Leaders Colloquium and Summit (IPSLCS) and the interprofessional “nurses training program, “Oral Health and Nursing-A Team Approach to Population Health”. The 12-month program focused on the health and oral health status of the residents in the state of Louisiana. The majority of the state consists of designated health shortage areas where large numbers of families do not receive dental care and adequate medical care.

Throughout his Presidency, Dr. Marlon Henderson, NDA President and a native of Shreveport, LA has emphasized the organization's position on health disparities and equity stating, “The NDA is intentional in our efforts to enhance access to care. In our quest for oral health equity, it has long been important to the NDA to build a diverse pipeline and a pathway for future healthcare professionals. By advancing oral health equity, and strengthening community voices, there will be an increased likelihood of new state policies that will increase access to dental care in Louisiana's most underserved communities. I am proud that the CareQuest initiative focuses on strengthening community voices and increasing health advocacy in my home state!”

The 2023 initiative involved 1) a review of the three NDA programs to ascertain their influence on the community at large, the health professional community and academic institutions; 2) strategic alignment with like-minded entities with proven track records of community engagement and legislative advocacy; and 3) exploration of opportunities for informing and impacting health policy and health systems reform. A key component was the inter-professional student leadership development program and the emphasis on collaboration for collective action.

The Interprofessional Student Leaders Colloquium and Summit (IPSLCS) included hybrid programming consisting of virtual sessions and onsite sessions in New Orleans and Washington, DC. Emphasis was on dental shortage areas in the north and northeast regions of Louisiana, the central area and the southern region. The goal of the students' initiative was to provide evidence-based findings that could help them address the problem and provide recommendations to improve the access problems.

Now in its 6th year, students with demonstrated leadership abilities are selected to participate in this unique experience. Leadership training involves critical thinking, group projects and multidisciplinary collaboration to confront real-world problems. This year's training included:

- Fundamentals of research design, data collection and analysis
- Behind the Scenes with the RAM Leadership Team www.ramusa.org
- Legislative advocacy for effective policy reform
- Workgroup presentations and mock legislative testimony

The New Orleans program, held from July 20-22, 2023 during the NDA Annual Convention, featured three outstanding leadership trainers: Drs. Alvenia Rhea Albright, Judy Greenlea-Taylor and Brian Swann. Participants included students from Southern University-Baton Rouge School of Social Work, Louisiana State University School of Dentistry, Dillard University School of Nursing, Xavier University School of Pharmacy and leaders from the New Orleans Chapter of the National Black Nurses Association. Attendees participated in each component of the program including mandatory webinars, a leadership training program and the NDA-HEALTH NOW® community outreach program for 200 summer campers at the Milne Recreation Center. They also participated in an interactive, sensory immersion session and a group tour of the NDA Exhibit Hall, where the group interacted with NDA exhibitors and received first-hand information from vendors about the latest advances in dental materials, prevention and state-of-the-art technology.

The Washington, DC program was hosted by the Howard University College of Dentistry and RAM (Remote Area Medical). It was conducted on three Saturdays in November (November 4th, 11th and 18th). On November 4, 2023, the illustrious leadership trainers were Suzanne Randolph Cuningham, Ph.D. (MayaTech Lead Researcher), Donnie Turner, M.A., J.D.(U.S. Senate Policy Expert) and Nicole Cheek, DDS, (NDA President-elect). On November 11th, Mary Brown (Remote Area Medical [RAM] Volunteer Coordinator) led the group on a behind-the-scenes tour of a community outreach event held at Prince George's Community College in Prince George's County, MD, hosted by the Prince Georges County Links, Incorporated and RAM. The group consisted of dental students from Howard University College of Dentistry, Public Health and Health Administration students from the University of Maryland and a Business major graduate from Hampton University. The New Orleans NDA-HEALTH NOW® Advisory Committee members served as virtual mentors for the group. The DC program concluded with group presentations, mock legislative testimonies and the students' video testimonials about the program.

Preliminary findings will be published at the end of the first grant cycle. Survey results and data analysis in the first year will be used to develop a Communications Plan that will provide opportunities for the NDA and its partners to speak with a unified, amplified voice for Advocacy, Justice, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion and to address oral-systemic health as a driver for whole-body health.

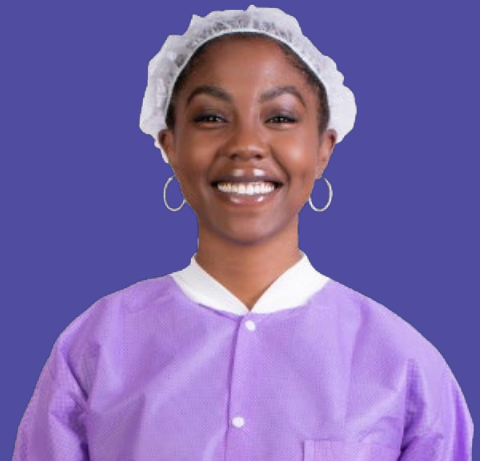

Happy New Year NDA Members! Chapter 7 Section 12(2) tasks the Chairman of the Board of Trustees to appoint members to the various committees that will ensure the mission and governance of NDA are fulfilled. If you are interested in serving in a year capacity in any of our committees, ***please send correspondence and a CV to NDA1913chairman@gmail.com.***

Auditing Committee will review grants proposals and grants awarded to NDA. The Auditing Committee will ensure proper allocation of funds for programmatic design and will also ensure all deliverables as specified by the grantor are satisfied.

Committee on Publications The duties of the Committee on Publications shall be to:

- A. Act as an advisory committee to the Journal Editor.
- B. Act with the Journal Editor in the selection of the Publisher.
- C. Determine with the Journal Editor the policy in regard to frequency of publication and distribution.
- D. Act with the Journal Editor in determination of the advertising policy of the publication.
- E. Assist the Editor in the procurement of articles for publication.

The Journal Editor shall be the Editor-in-Chief of the official journal of the Association (The Flossline) and, as such, shall exercise full editorial control over such publications, subject only to policies and procedures established by the House of Delegates or these Bylaws. He shall have the right to appoint his editorial associates with approval of the Board of Trustees; he shall be a member ex-officio of the Publications Committee. He shall perform such other duties as are prescribed by the Board of Trustees or these Bylaws.

The Editorial Board will be appointed by the Chairman of the Board of Trustees with the approval of the Board. The Editorial Board shall serve as an advisory Board for publications other than The Flossline (i.e. pamphlets, brochures, website, advertisements, marketing and promotional documents, and signage for programs/events).

Committee on Policy Review will review any and all public statements and actions by Association officers or representatives of the Association, made on behalf of and/or in the name of the Association, shall be made and taken only with the specific and expressed approval of the Executive Committee of the Association's Board of Trustees or full Board of Trustees.

Civil Rights Luncheon Planning Committee will work with the Executive Director to plan and implement the program for the Civil Rights Luncheon held during the Annual Convention. This Committee will also ensure the NDA will follow through with educating members and the community on social determinants of health that widens the gap for access to healthcare.

Annual Convention Planning Committee Chair will work with the Executive Director, the Local Planning Committee, and the Events Planner to ensure a smooth, informative, and enjoyable Annual Convention.

Greetings to all esteemed members of the National Dental Association, Student National Dental Association, National Dental Hygienists Association, National Dental Assistant Association, and the Auxiliary of the National Dental Association. I am Dr. Nicole Cheek, and it is my honor to serve you as your 100th President of the National Dental Association!

Before I begin, I want to take a moment to express my heartfelt gratitude to all of our sponsors. Your support reflects your recognition of the NDA mission as a truly deserving cause. I would also like to thank the Gala Planning Committee Chairpersons, members, and especially the student members. (Please stand) These are dental students, DOCTORAL students, that have, for the last TWO whole days, taken a considerable amount of time away from their Final Exams (remember back, Docs, no small feat), to match the tireless work of the Committee to stage this wonderful event. Please, join me in showing our gratitude by giving them a hand. Thank you to all of the leadership of every NDA Family organization here tonight. A special thank you to my immediate predecessor, Dr. Marlon Henderson, Our Bridge Builder. It is through

your hard work and dedication that we persevere.

The NDA had its beginnings in 1913 as an organization formed out of exclusion when African Americans were denied admission to the existing dental association.

However, we have grown and continue today as an organization that safeguards the well-being, dignity, and rights of our oral health professionals, our students, patients, and our communities. It doesn't matter where we go, we are always highly regarded by the organizations and institutions with whom we partner.

This is so important because, as mighty and amazing as we are, the work we do requires more than what even WE can achieve alone. We need our allies and partners, organizations and foundations, and even corporations whose goals and missions align with ours, in order to achieve the monumental successes we have delivered in the past and must continue to deliver in the future.

At a time when diversity, equity, and inclusion are under attack, be clear, that means WE are under attack. Our efforts to move the needle on our 3.8% are under attack. The progress that we have made against racism and discrimination is under attack. This is a pivotal time in history when the NDA is needed more than ever. We are a shining example of strength, unity, and inclusivity, standing tall against the forces that seek to divide us. And know this. We may not regularly experience or witness situations where something racist, discriminatory, and/or damaging happens to our members or our most vulnerable populations. But when these things DO happen, it is NDA that answers the call.

When I first started working with the NDA, becoming its President was never my ambition. After graduating from dental school, while waiting for the State Dental Board to grant me my dental license, I needed a job. Together, with joy in our hearts, we will continue to make a difference and leave a lasting legacy.
